

The nymphaeum refers to a structure built above a spring or a fountain. For us, it also serves as a very useful retaining wall!

Our nymphaeum was installed in 1904 by the owner at the time, Charles Claverie, under the direction of architect Henriquet and in collaboration with Jules Vacherot, the garden designer.

The top photo shows the original plan dated 1904. The one below shows the result after restoration. It's almost like playing a game of "spot the differences"!



We had been dreaming of this restoration for over 20 years. It took 9 months, from November 2023 to July 2024.
